# Class of the Week

Well we have had a super week in Rundell Class! We have been learning about the Tudors for our topic and we have found out so many interesting things about Henry VIII and life in Tudor times. In our writing work we are going to be writing a non-chronological report about every day life so we have been researching food and drink and crime and punishment – Tudor punishments were really horrible!

In science we have been investigating air resistance and the effects of this. We made paper aeroplanes which we tested to find which travelled the furthest. We have some amazing paper plane makers in our class! During our investigation we looked at the importance of collecting more than one set of data to ensure our results are reliable.

I have been extremely impressed with the children's attitude and effort in our French unit. We have been learning about fruits and can now name ten. We are moving on next week to say which of the fruits we like or do not like. The children have worked really hard and seem to enjoy these lessons – especially as there is so much talking!!!

Thank you so much to all of the parents who joined us for our reading breakfast on Wednesday. The children absolutely loved having the opportunity to share their reading with you. Reading is so important, and by sharing a book with your children you are developing so many skills – knowing a range of vocabulary, being able to find information (from the text as well as pictures), asking questions about the world and making links. My boys are 15 and 13 now and I can't tell you how much I miss reading with them and them reading to me. Four of the children in our class received their red badges today for 25 reads at home. Well done children! I hope more will be getting some very soon.
