Class of the Week

Hi parents and carers, we have had another fun week in Cowell class. The children have been immersed in writing instructions about, 'How to become a Gladiator!' They have been getting fit, learning how to use a sword, identifying equipment they need and then used their experiences to write instructions about it.

In maths, they have been learning to add and subtract mentally with Neil and Caleb impressing me by using mental strategies to subtract numbers from 4 digit numbers. Children are also learning their tables using songs and computing activities. I particularly enjoyed the enthusiasm of Harmanpreet, Gurnoorpreet and Graciana who were keen to sing their 7 times table song on the way to swimming.

Many children have been in the language club, sharing their understanding of the Kurdish language and some learning some words and phrases in Kurdish.

In art the children have been learning about the artist Claude Monet (the founder of impressionism) and are beginning to reproduce one of his paintings. I can't wait to see the finished products.

Today the children worked in teams (becoming engineers) to build and test a Roman Aqueduct. The results were spectacular. Not only did the teams generally work very well together, the aqueducts all managed to carry water from one place to another. The children even discussed (after much amusement and a lot of water) how to improve a design fault after one aqueduct collapsed. Tomorrow they will combine their writing and design and technology skills, by writing instructions for another class, about how to build an aqueduct.
